While Hubbard COLA achieved many successes this year, we continue to have more to do for lake protection in Hubbard County. We are looking forward to more challenges in 2014 and encourage you to help COLA achieve our mission. This year's accomplishments are highlighted below:

- Sustainability of Lake Associations –Indiana University Capstone Study completed for Hubbard COLA. 7 lake associations participated. Study provided to COLA with recommendations for improving and sustaining lake associations.
- 2. Redesign of COLA's website (by Jeff Mosner) and creation of a Facebook page for COLA by Indiana University Capstone students
- 3. Wild rice fund raising project and 3M sponge project fundraiser developed by John Hastings.
- Develop constant contact with COLA members through monthly/bi-monthly electronic newsletter.
- Winning Hubbard County Food Shelf Chili cook off with AIS chili recipe – Lynn and Theora Goodrich

- 6. Another successful Children's Freshwater Festival co-hosted by COLA and SWCD—Education Committee.
- 7. 2013 Governor's Fishing Opener held in Park Rapids. COLA's involvement included volunteers for: Executive and Planning Committees, Chair of raffle sales, co-chair of Kid's fishing program and education; helping with raffle tickets sales, kids fishing, AIS and aquatic education booth and fish cleaning contest, fishing hosts. 14+ COLA members were involved in this year long community project.

- Development of cooperative program with Extension Office to provide various education programs for lake shore residents—Education Committee

WANT TO MAIL SOMETHING TO EVERY LAND OWNER ON YOUR LAKE?

- All COLA member lake associations can receive GIS data through COLA to help keep mailing addresses updated for all property owners on your lake. This data is available to your lake association as part of your association's COLA membership benefits. Below are the steps for receiving valuable GIS data on lakeshore owners on your lake.
- Call Ed Mutsch, 218-652-3038, with your Lake's need for the mailing data. Ed is trained to use the GIS data base and has access to the program through HC COLA annual subscription payment.
- Confirm data fields needed & your lake's COLA membership.
- Utilize Microsoft Excel and potentially MS Word to prepare your mailing.
