AIS Task Force Report

Strategic Action #10 By Ken Grob

- 1. County-wide watercraft inspection program continues to progress well for the summer. Inspections winding down. We are continuing to line up more inspection support for 2014. Presentations made to the Association of Hubbard County Townships on 9/16, County Commissioners on 9/3, and Frohn Township on 9/17(Beltrami County-Grace Lake). See Julie Kingsley's report for all the details on watercraft inspection results.
- 2. Almost all the Resort information folders have been distributed for this year, with a small survey on what the resort owners can do to help prevent AIS. Some Survey forms still need to be returned to Ken Grob so results can be summarized.
- 3. Work to develop a County-wide AIS Rapid Response Plan continues. Bob Berdahl is leading this project. Targeting end of year to have it completed.
- 4. I attended the presentation of the Cass County AIS Plan. Well done with lots of stakeholders involved. We hope to codify our Hubbard County Plan in a similar format before next spring.
- 5. I attended the Legacy Committee presentations on AIS funding requests. MN COLA Collaborative presentation was very professional and well done. Funds requested for LGU funding for inspections and decontamination stations was well thought out. Price tag too high (\$25MM). Waiting for Legacy Committee to publicize decisions of 2014 funding.
- 6. I attended a lecture by Dr. Dan Molloy (the inventor of Zequanox) who is one of the candidates for the Zebra Mussel Research position at the UM AIS Research center. His ideas on zebra mussel control were very impressive.....but the horizon for a solution is 5-10 years, depending on funding levels.
- 7. I intend to hold COLA AIS Committee and County Task Force Meetings in October to review 2013 results and set objectives for 2014.
- 8. LAKE ASSOCIATIONS NEED TO START PLANNING WATERCRAFT INSPECTION LEVELS FOR 2014. Actions needed:
 - $\sqrt{-1}$ Lake associations need to decide/commit to the level of inspections they want in 2014. This should be done by November.
 - $\sqrt{-1}$ Obtain commitments from lake residents (lake association) for 2014 financial support level
 - $\sqrt{-1}$ Contact their Townships/Cities to indicate what is needed for support in 2014 (same as 2013 or more)
 - $\sqrt{1}$ Attend township annual meeting in March to confirm support
