Water Monitoring plus Zebra Mussel Veliger and Spiny Waterflea Sampling:

The ZM Veliger, SWF and Water Monitoring were completed for the month of July. In the case of the 22 samples for ZM Veliger and the 12 samples for SWF, there were no lakes testing positive for either. Also the 2019 Water Monitoring results are starting to show up on the RMB website https://www.rmbel.info/data/

The next Water Monitoring date is August 18 with coolers returned to Charlie's by 11:00 AM on Monday, August 19th.

Nicholas Macklem, Hubbard County Environmental Services provided this AIS Program update as of 7/23/19:

14,500 inspections 60% entering 40% exiting
77 with drain plug in at entering .5%
189 with plants, mud
79 decons so far this year
39 lakes being inspected with around 50 inspectors
\$15.00 per hour for starting inspector (\$21.00 per hour charged)
