Update from Peter Tuomisto for Cooler Monday, July 20th :

1.) Please do not arrive earlier than 9:00 a.m. at Charlies to drop off your sample coolers and pick up your empty coolers. The Trailer will be at Charlies by 9:00 a.m. and will be there until 11:00 a.m.

2.) The Veliger tests can be done between now and July 20 with all sample bottles to be dropped off at Charlies on July 20 with the coolers. The Veliger sample bottles do not need to be refrigerated. Preserve with 91% alcohol.

3.) Please do not put loose ice in your coolers. We need to keep the inside of the coolers as dry as we can so we do not develop mold in them. Adding extra ice to your coolers is a good thing but only if it is in a sealed baggie.

### AIS Operating Team:

An HC COLA email was sent last week regarding the time sensitive information related to AIS programs. Some lake associations provided additional 2020 supplemental income to HC Env Svcs for watercraft inspections by 6/26/20.

- 1) By 7/13/2020, please send <u>hccolamn@gmail.com</u> your "best estimate" of the amount of <u>2021</u> supplemental watercraft inspection hours your lake association will want to purchase for next summer. Eric Buitenwerf, HC Env Svcs Director explains that although the County Board has not yet provided specific instruction as to what it would like to see in next year's budget, the Board's goal is to provide taxpayers with as much levy relief as possible given the economic impacts of COVID. So Eric's best guess is that the Board will likely continue the expense minimization efforts it implemented for 2020 which included foregoing the County levy contribution amount.
- 2) Both the MN DNR and the County have now approved placing the zebra mussel settlement samplers (ZMSS) on the public access docks for this summer as part of our HC COLA "Eyes on the Water" program <u>http://www.hubbardcolamn.org/eyes-on-the-water---early-detection.html</u>.

Adopt your access, place a ZMSS and email <u>hccolamn@gmail.com</u> to track. Then we can determine if there are additional lakes that need adopting yet. Check the lakeshore / shoreline for AIS when there too.

Start checking the ZMSS in Aug. The sampler must be removed by Oct, clean it up for next year & complete the HC COLA online survey. <u>http://www.hubbardcolamn.org/eyes-on-the-water---early-detection.html</u>
